

\$500.00 IVMAA MEMBERS DEPENDENTS BURSARY PROGRAM

Available only to IVMAA members dependents

PURPOSE

To recognize the scholastic achievement of dependents of IVMAA members and to encourage them to continue at an approved university or college course of study leading to a degree or diploma beyond the secondary school level.

AWARDS

Two awards are available to qualifying students attending eligible post-secondary institutions.

The awards cover tuition and compulsory fees charged by the institution to be attended, up to an annual maximum of \$500.00.

Compulsory fees are assessed by the institution at the beginning of each academic year and include student union fees, health fees, etc. These awards DO NOT cover charges for room and board, textbooks, field trips, equipment, travel, voluntary or personal activities or elective courses over and above the normal course load.

ELIGIBILITY

1. APPLICANTS

Those eligible for awards must be:

Dependent children or legal wards of IVMAA members who have been members (in good standing) for one year on September 1st of each year in which application is made and are still members on the commencement of the academic year.

Applicants can only be recipients of the bursary on a one time basis only. No exceptions will be given.

2. QUALIFYING EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTION

Award winners must attend a Canadian university or college which is a member of the Association of Universities and Colleges of Canada and primarily funded by government grants or a Canadian college or institute of applied arts and technology or similar institution under the jurisdiction of provincial departments of education.

3. COURSES

There is no restriction to the course of study provided that it:

- a) leads to a recognized degree, diploma or certificate
- b) requires the student to pay fees
- c) is not of the apprenticeship type

ACADEMIC QUALIFICATIONS

To qualify for the bursary, an overall average of 75% or greater must be obtained in subjects in the first full time year of a post secondary program.

An applicant must have completed at least one year of post secondary education in order to qualify for the bursary, and be enrolled in the second year.

Questions relating to the acceptability of any subjects for award purposes will be considered on the basis of the University or College practises.

The Awards committee reserves the right to modify an award if a student is the recipient of other assistance.

It will be the responsibility of the applicant to supply ALL information required by the Awards Committee on the Bursary Award Program Application
